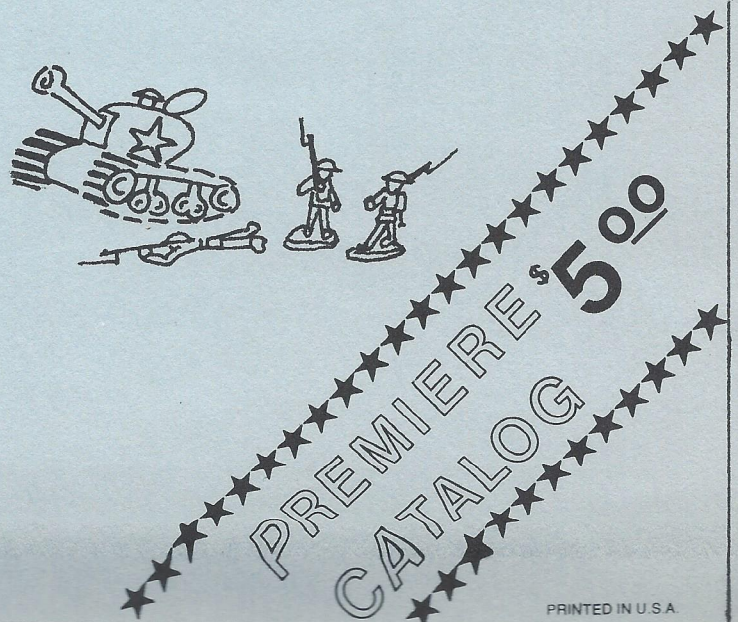
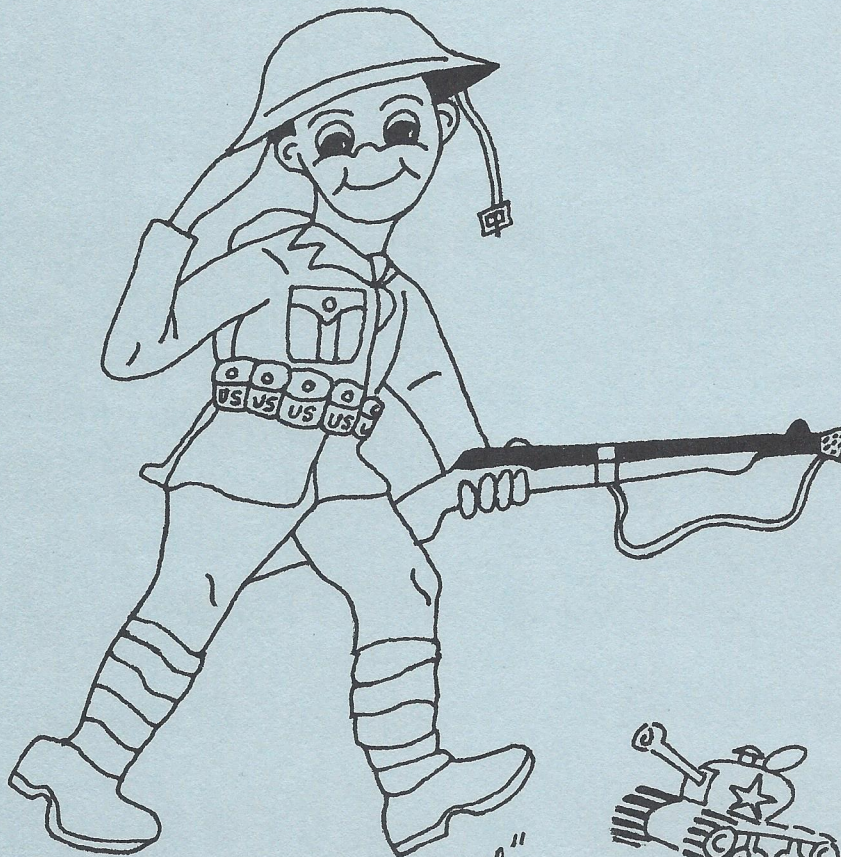

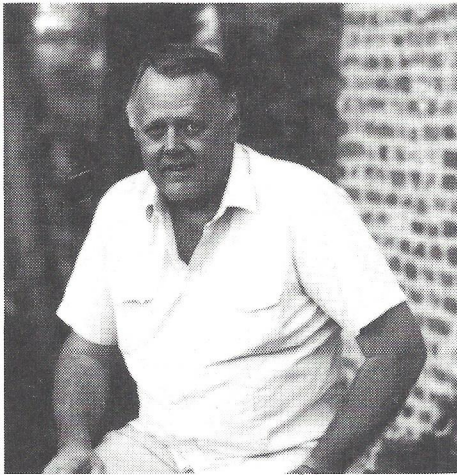

My introduction to toy soldiers occurred on Christmas day of 1941 in Clinton, Iowa. My parents had set up a boxed Barclay hospital set with the #199 tent, the stretcher bearers, and the wounded soldier. They had embellished this set up with a low wall of sandbags around the tent, and a profusion of Béton soldiers were standing on the colorful packages under a brightly lit tree. Santa Claus really started something that Christmas, and for many years he added new troops to my growing collection. We played hard in those "radio days", our imaginations fueled by the newsreels of the day. Trenches were dug around shade trees in the back yard, sand box battles raged on lazy summer days, and when it rained we set up our armies on the bedroom floor. When lead soldiers became scarce, we ate the cereals that entitled us to balsa and paper aircraft, and added cardboard sets from Built-Rite, coupled with composition troops to our armies. Unfortunately, as with a great many of us, my interest began to wane in my teens- those glorious years when the bicycles of myself and my friends shifted from Woolworths to the Rialto theater to watch "Sheena of the Jungle"!

Early in 1984, Sharon and I were wandering through an antique show on Miami Beach when I spotted the #199 hospital tent and 16 Barclay soldiers. I had no idea that any soldiers had outlived the Red Ryders and M-80's of the 50's! I also had no idea there were other collectors in the world, but I knew that I was hooked! Not knowing where I could find more soldiers in quantity, I bought some new zinc soldier molds to see how molds were made. The idea of producing my own army intrigued me, and I began to whittle a soldier out of balsa wood. I wanted something in a battle pose that Barclay and Manoil hadn't made, and thus was born the wounded soldier in a foxhole (H-2). After lots of reading, much experimentation, and a few major disasters in mold making, the desired effect was achieved, and I was delighted with the results! Several months later I met Phil Savino of Micanopy, Florida at an antique mall show. He had some old toy soldiers for sale, which I bought, and expressed interest when I told him what I was doing with my hobby. I showed him my efforts, and he strongly urged and encouraged me to continue the line and manufacture my soldiers. Holt's Hobbies became a reality in June of 1984, and has evolved into a steadily growing business and hobby that has become my sole activity.

This catalogue illustrates our efforts in creating a new line of soldiers in action poses never produced by the old companies, but compatible with them. At this writing we offer over 100 items (inclusive of pieces comprising sets) which are hollow cast in one of three ways: two pieces soldered together at the waist, out the back with a field pack soldered over the sprue hole, or drop cast out the bottom (hole visible). All helmets are cast on, the soldiers are cleaned, painted with a high grade acrylic enamel, and baked. Prices vary due to the complexity of the casting; some figures require soldering several pieces to form the finished figure, while others can be made using simple two piece molds.

We've worked to better our soldiers over the years, and remain open to the constructive criticism of collectors. We also encourage and welcome requests from customers as to figures they would like to see manufactured. We are a small company, and for this reason we are limited to the quantity of pieces that can be hand cast and finished. Delivery time ranges from four to six weeks from the time your order is received until it reaches you. At this writing we have approximately 500 collectors on our list, and receive a growing number of inquiries from all over the world.

We do not sell unpainted castings, nor do we sell to retail outlets of any kind, preferring instead to service collectors personally. Should you need information of any kind regarding the hobby, need other sources for accessories, advice on painting, or just want to "talk soldiers", we're here to help however we can! We also swap soldiers, tanks and equipment in dime store scale for our new dime stores! I have included a want list sheet which I will update periodically.

Should the shipment arrive damaged in an undamaged carton, call me collect as soon as possible, and I will remake the pieces for you. * The original H-3, American officer kneeling firing pistol of 1984 issue was discontinued in 1986 and the mold destroyed. This figure had no apperture between the arms. Approximately 80 of these were issued. The H3A version was issued in 1990. This figure is better sculpted, has an apperture between the arms and stands better due to a round semi-base under both foot and knee. In 1984 HA-3, a field stack of three rifles with tin triangular base was issued along with a rack of nine rifles with tin rack. The rifle rack was discontinued (3 were issued) in 1985. It was replaced with a solid rack design. Both rifle rack and rifle stack were discontinued in 1987.

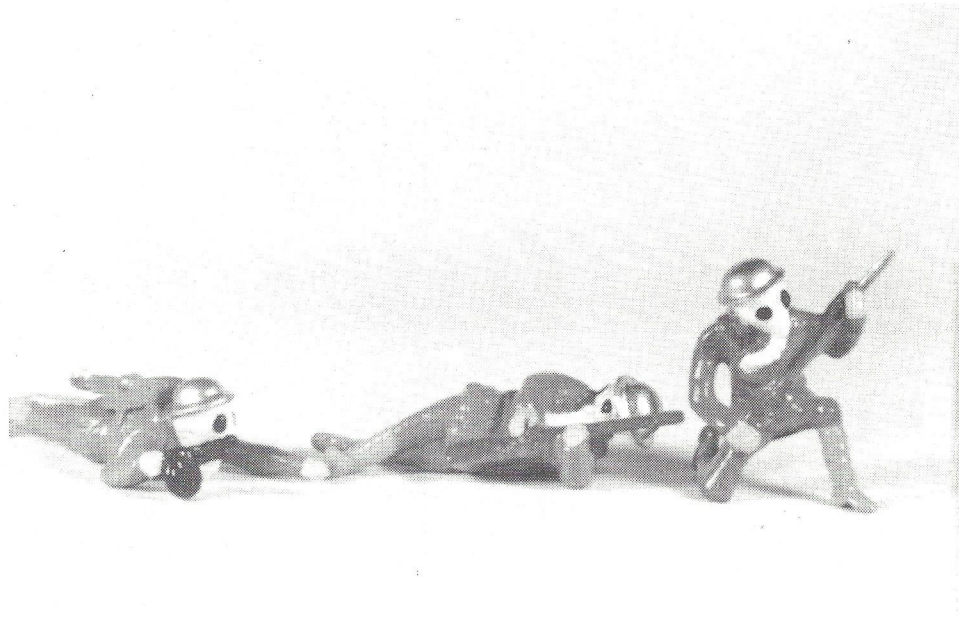




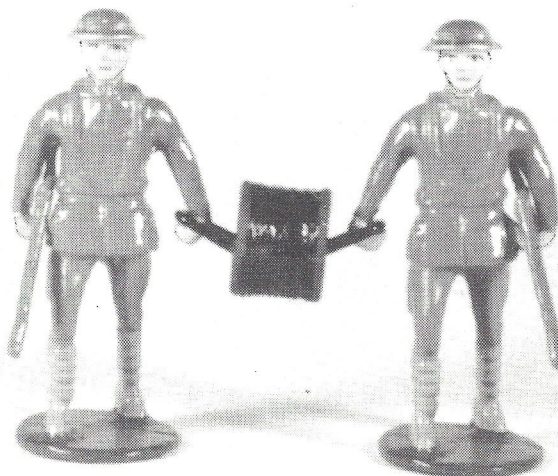

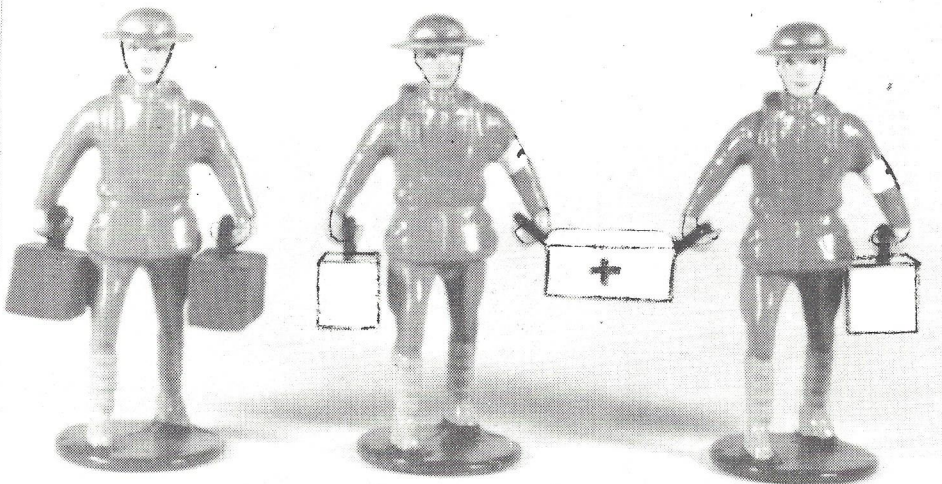

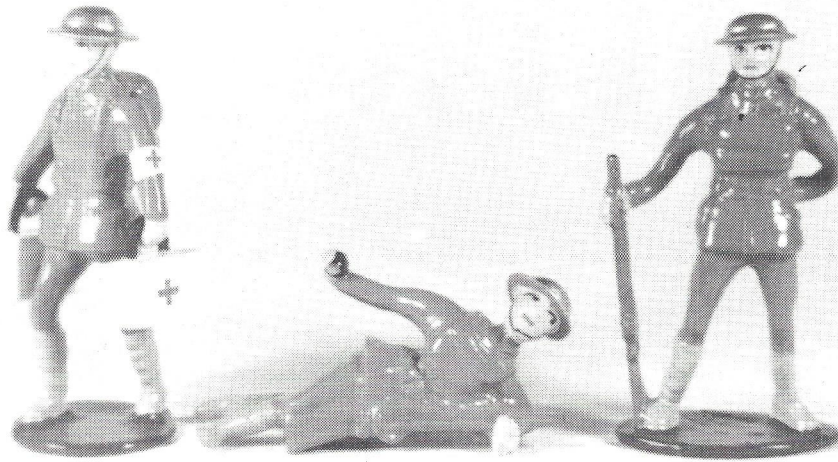

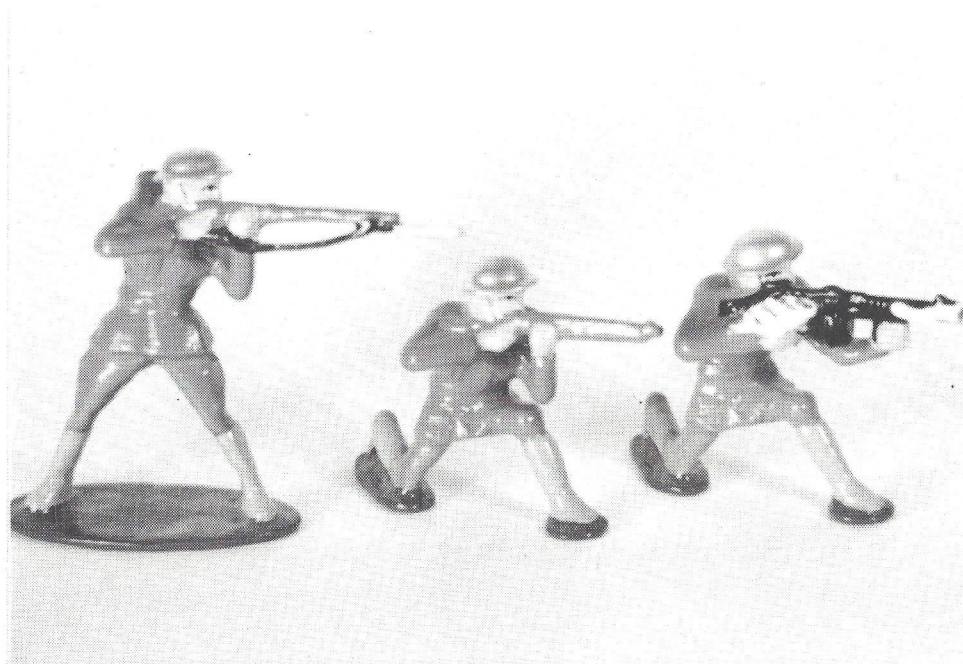

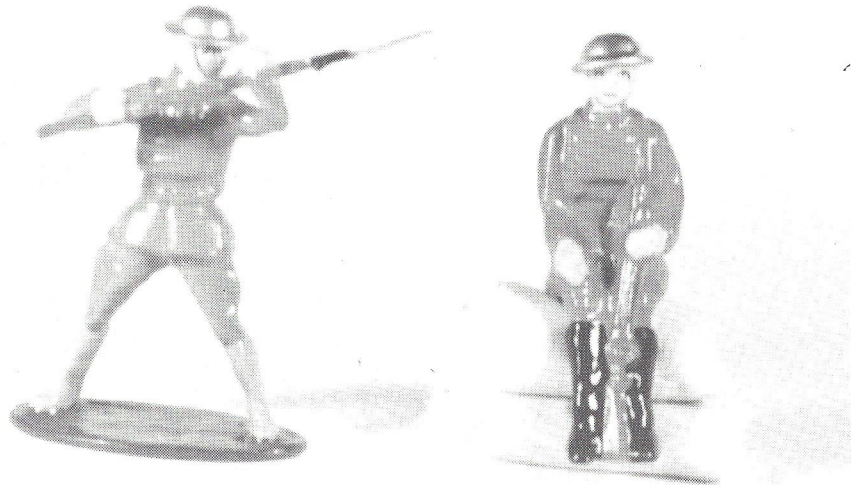

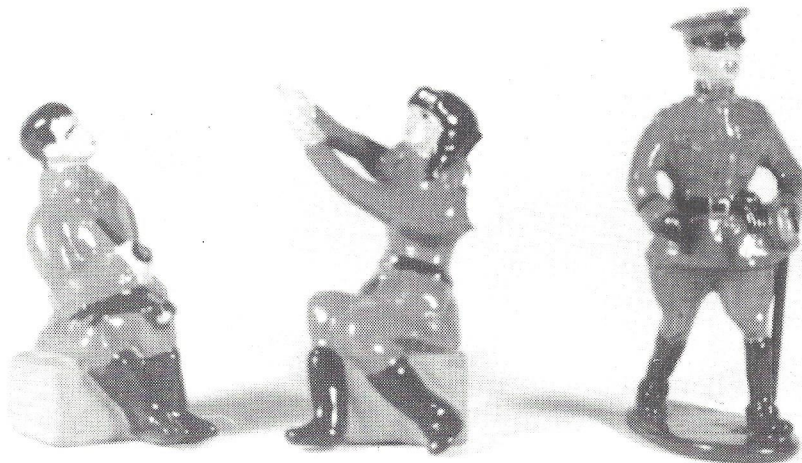

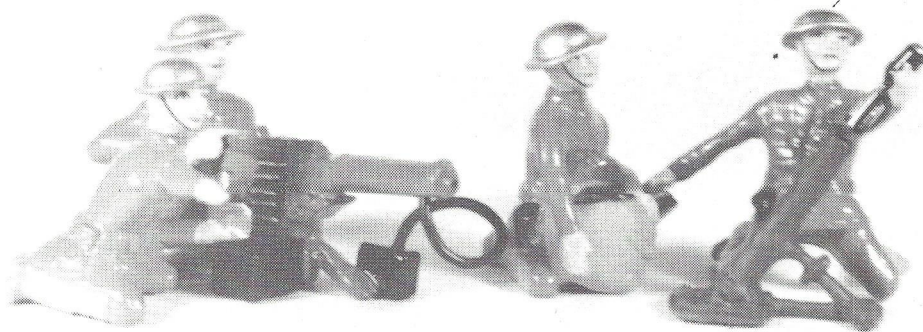

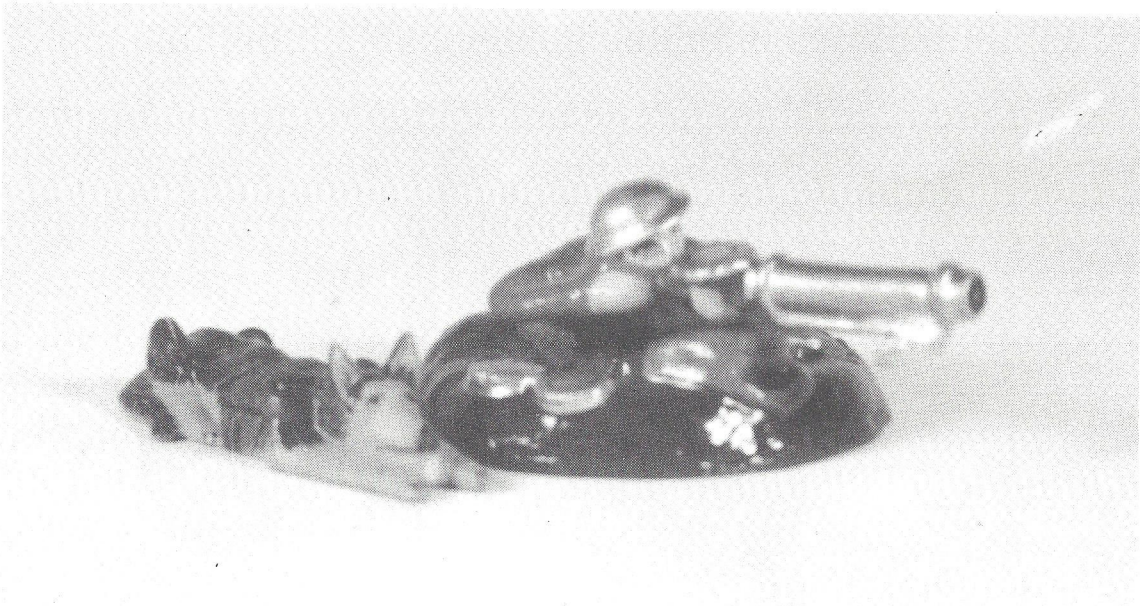


Motor Scout in Goggled Helmet with HSC1-Sidecar

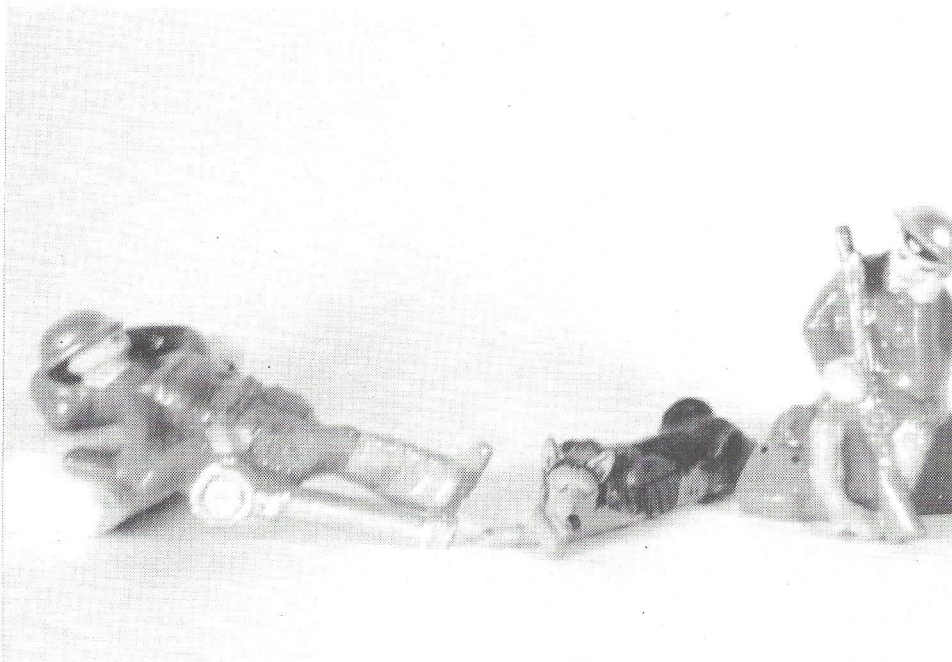

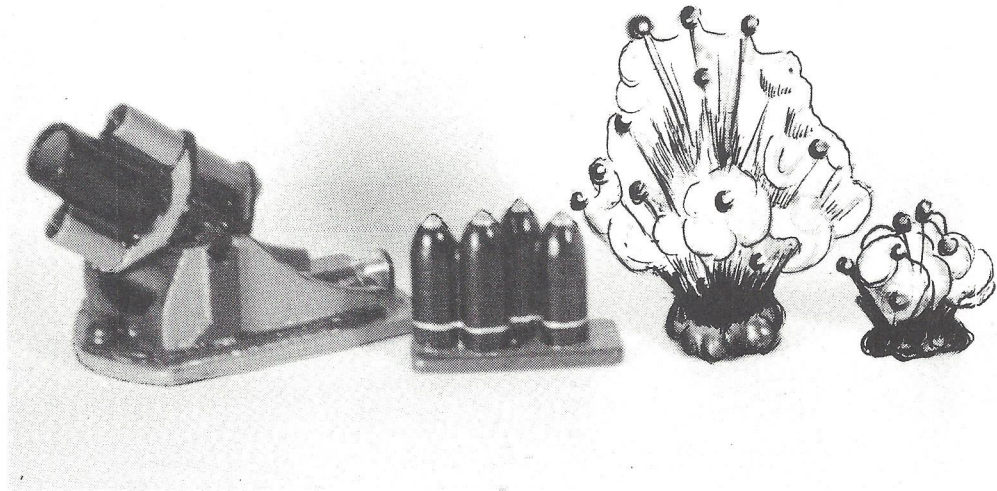

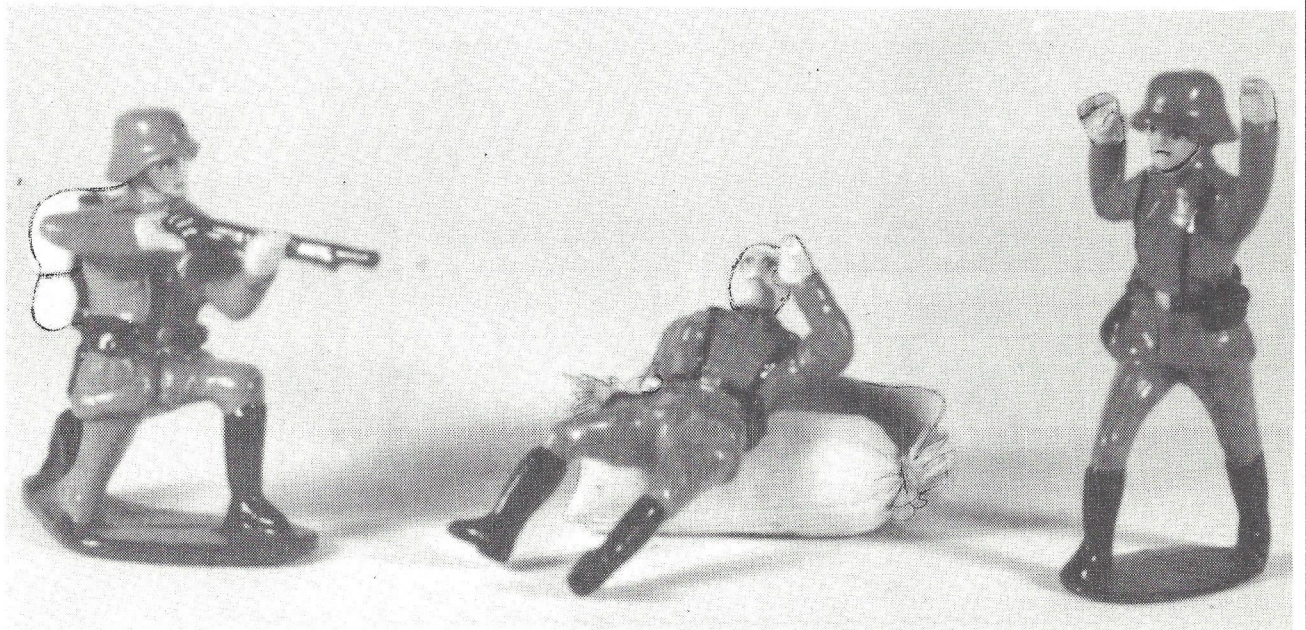

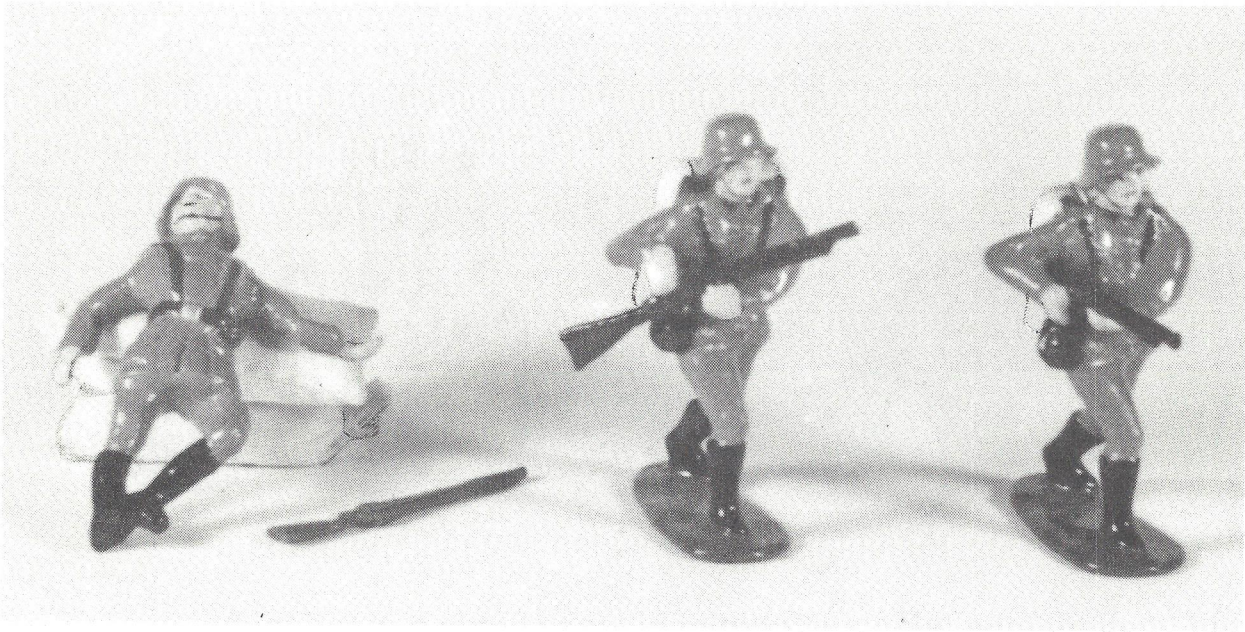

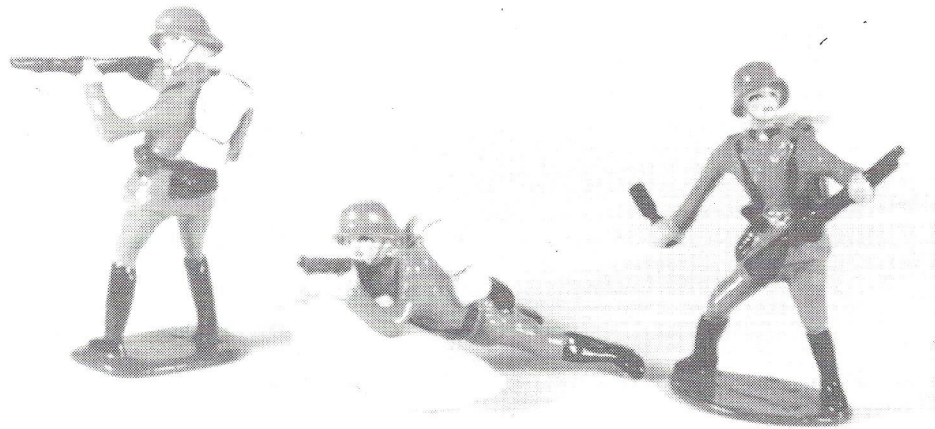

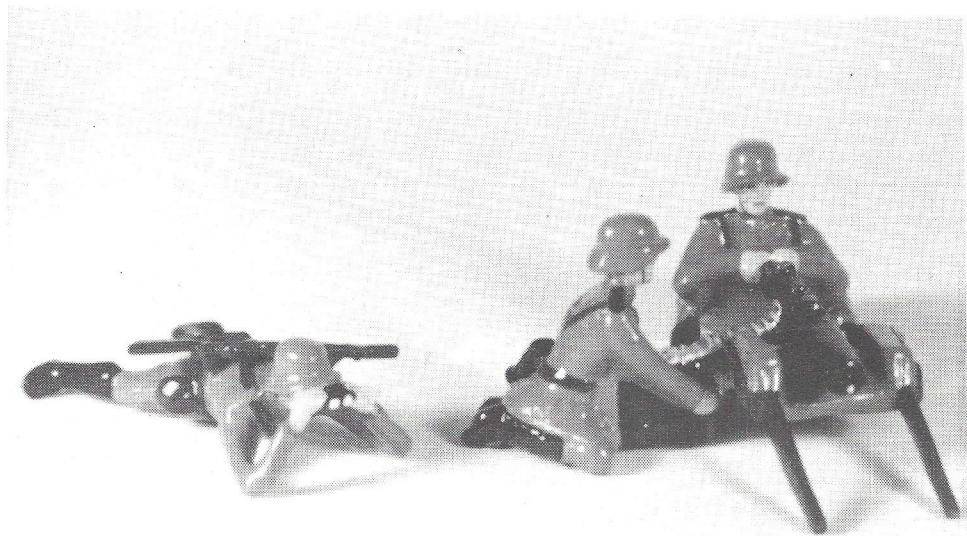

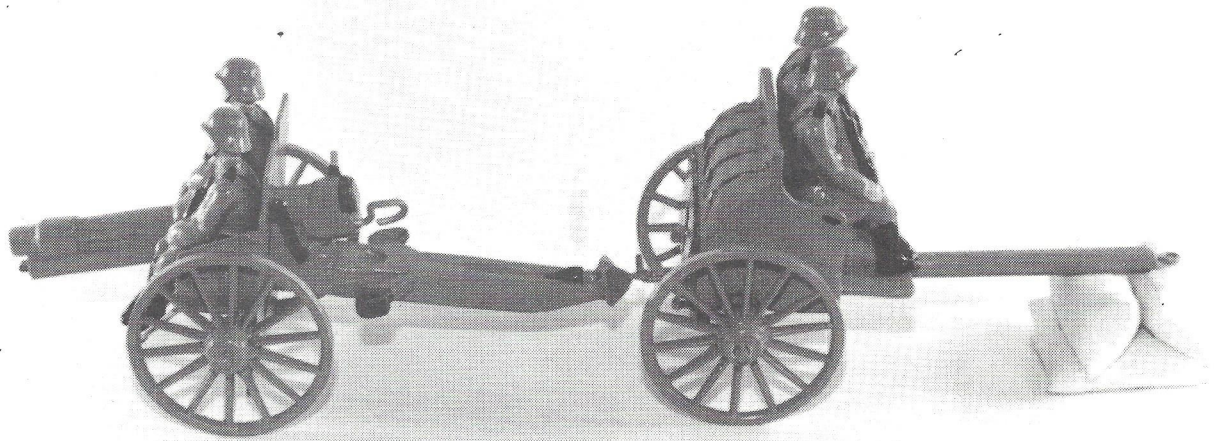

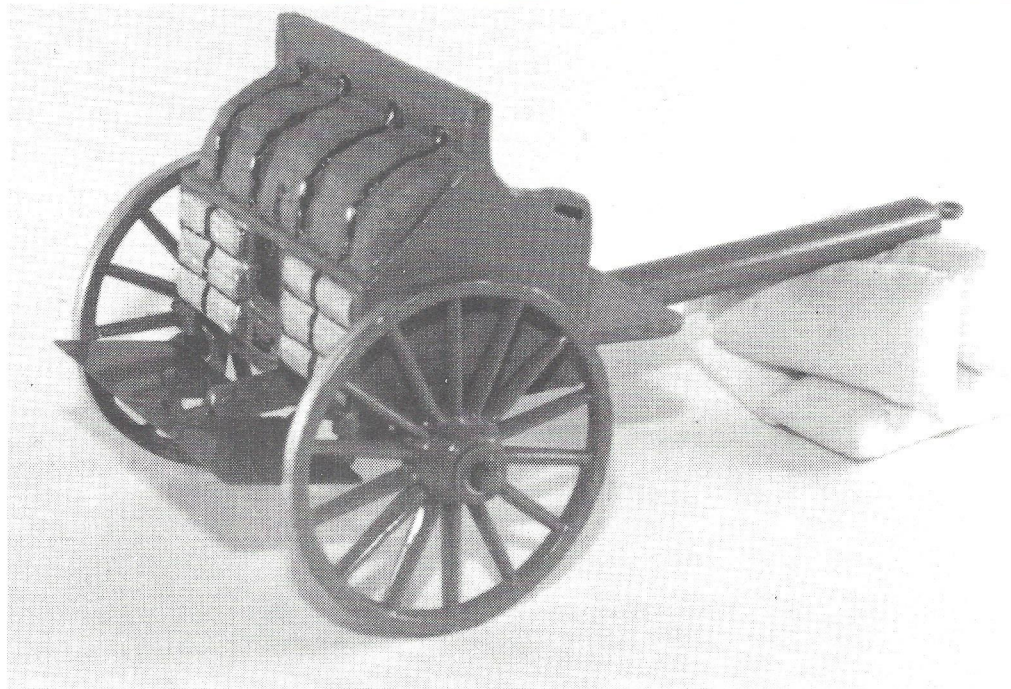

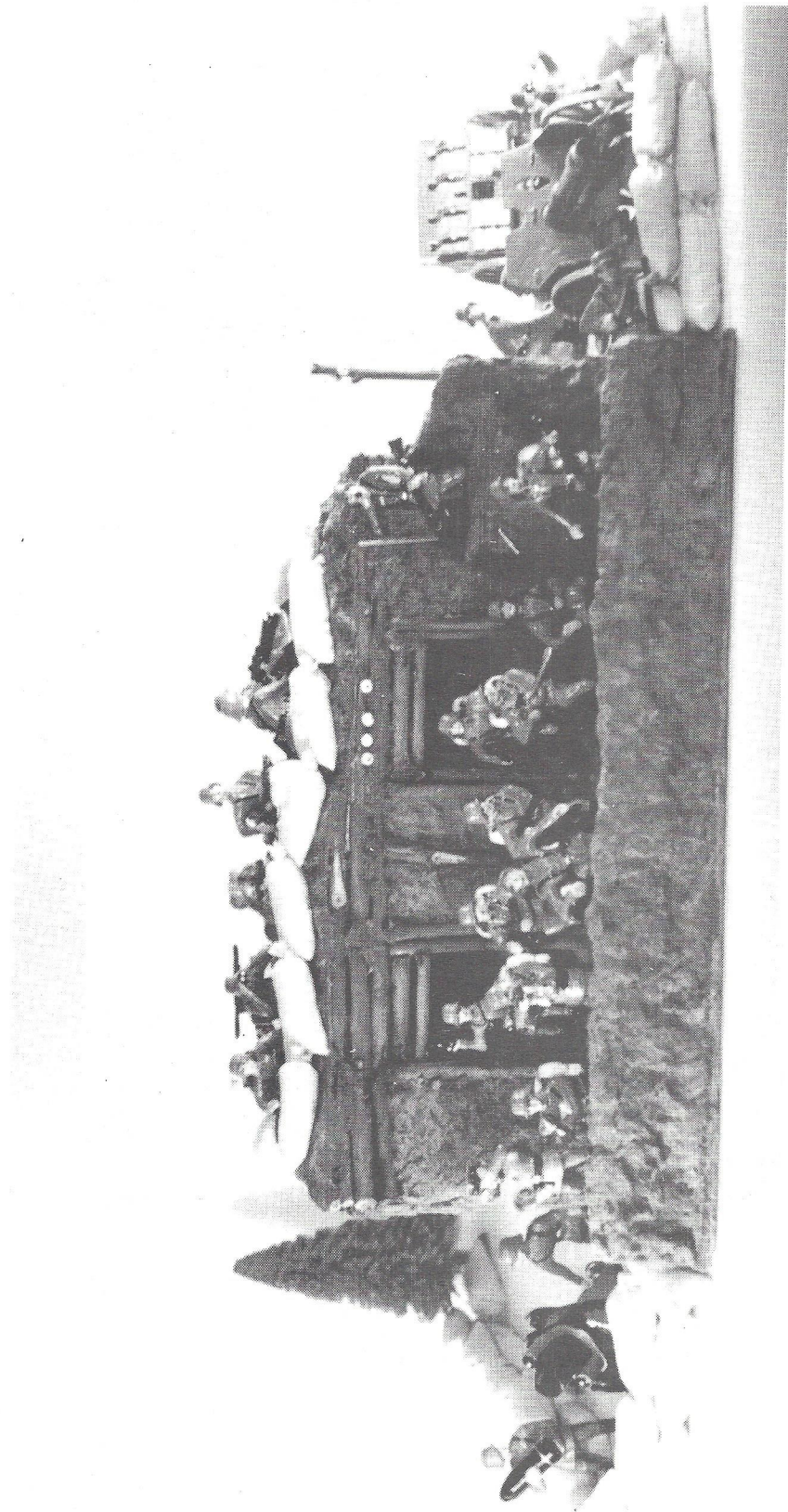

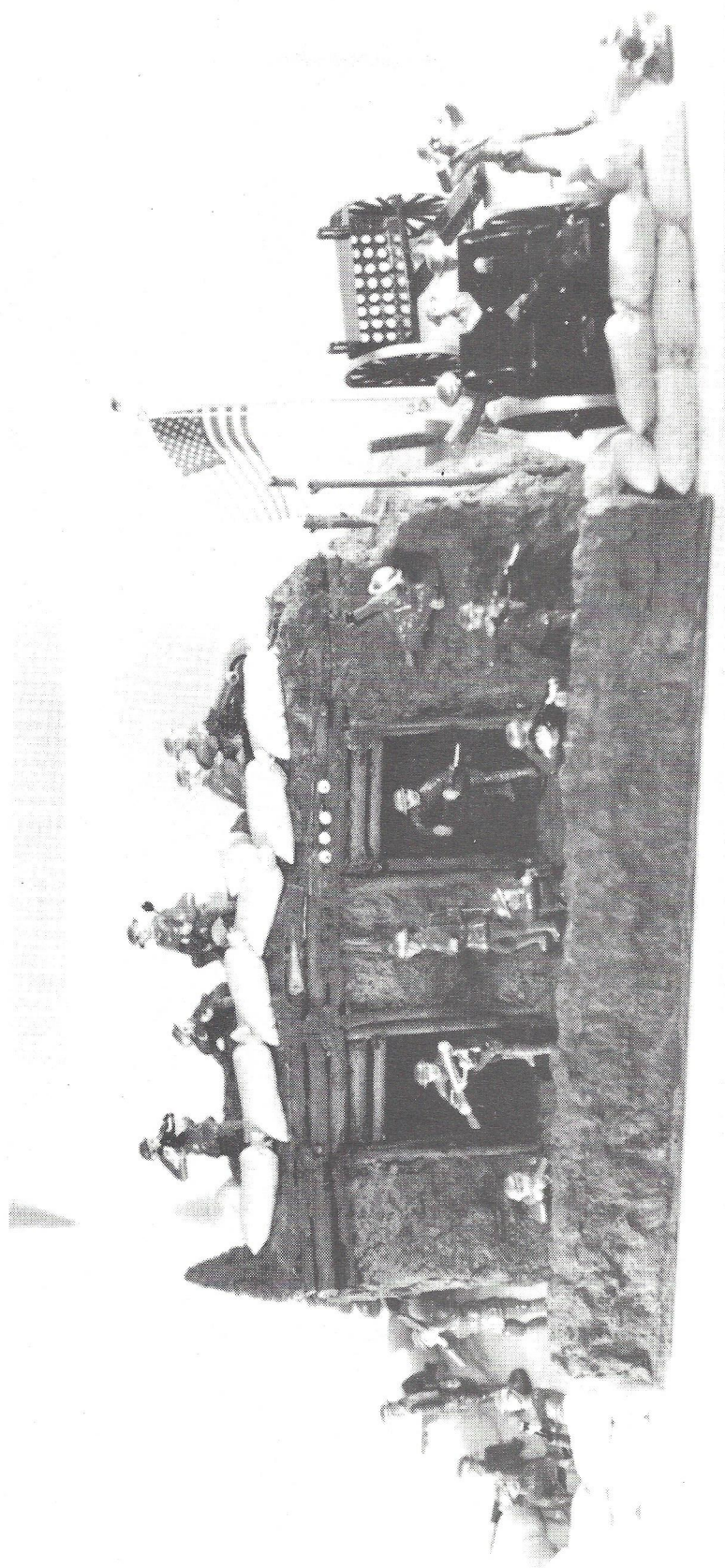

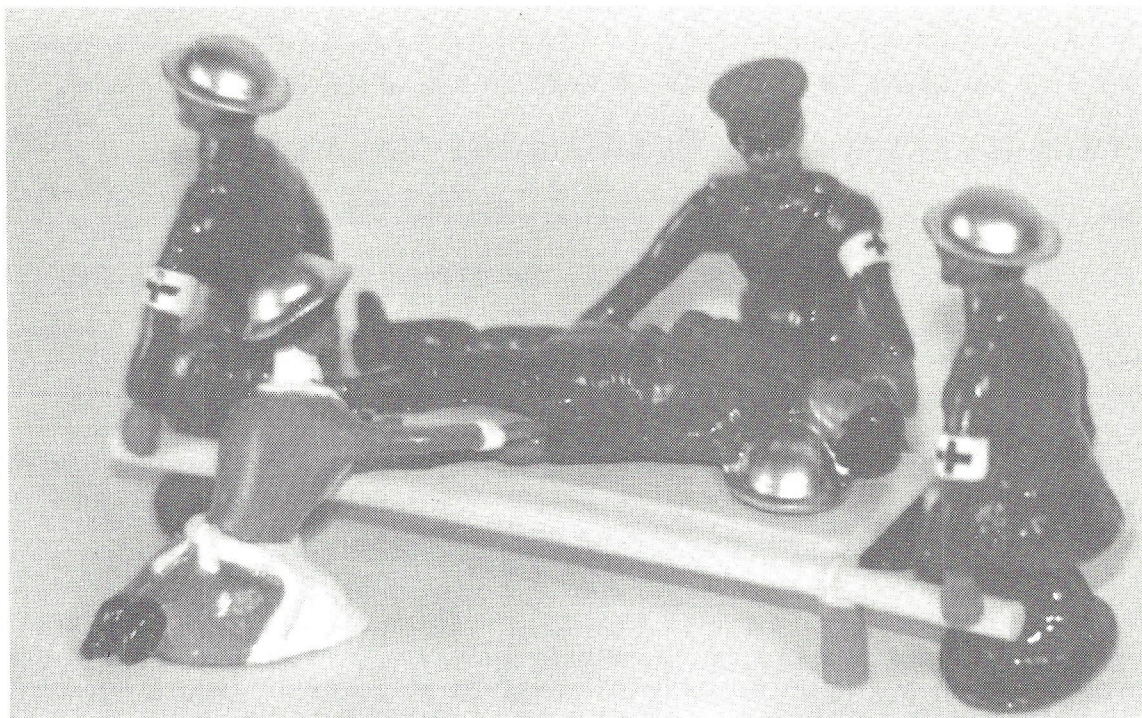
This Scene Depicts a Heavily Defended Bunker Using Our Combat German Infantrymen, Mortar Crew, Machine Gun Team and Artillery Crew



This Scene Depicts "Mopping Up" Action by Our Doughboys After Taking the Bunker

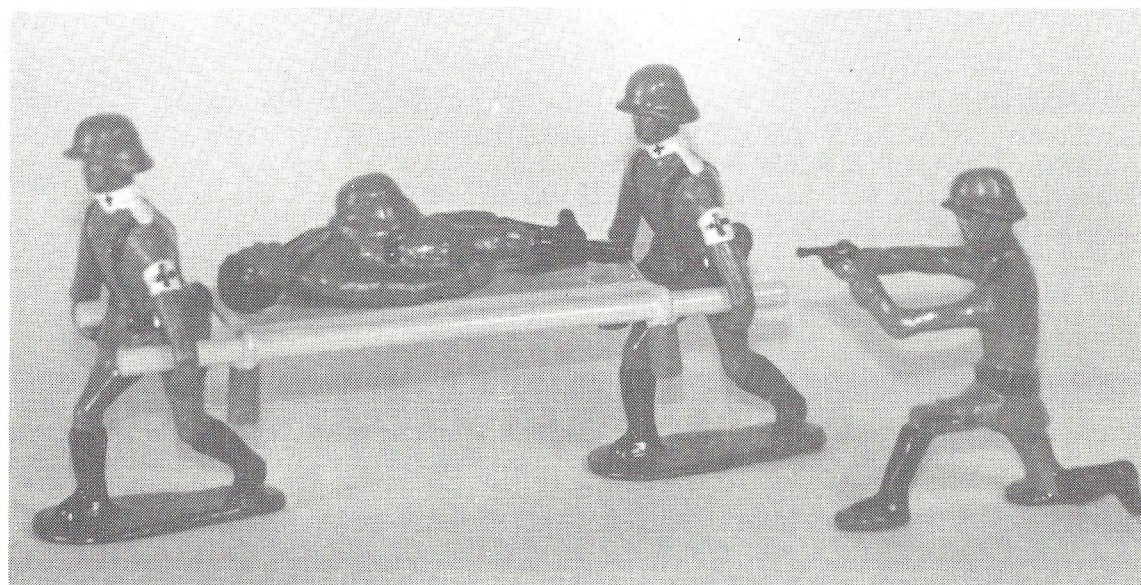

HERE'S WHAT I NEED!

ASTRA: Anti Aircraft Gun

Field Gun (Howitzer)

BARCLAY: Soldier box c/a 1940

TRIANG: Large gray windup tank approximately 12" long with rubber treads. (Marx E-12 like in appearance.)

MARX: E-12 tanks in distressed or working condition. By distressed I mean; beat up, won't run, parts missing. I always need treads, side sponsons, motors and turrets for these tanks. I collect all versions of Marx tanks except the brightly colored variations that roll over.

Lithographed soldiers on flat steel in excellent to mint. (Reference: Richard O'Brien's Collecting Toy Soldiers pages 187&188). If they are excellent to mint, I will double the book value in trade for these in order to complete my collection : #6 Mechanic with prop, #'s 18,19,20 Prone firing rifles/ affixing bayonet, #30 Ski trooper, #33 Nurse #35 Tank commander, #37 Naval chief petty officer, #42 Wounded, #44 and 45 Pilots, #46 Camouflaged sniper, #48 Naval commander, #49 Officer in dress uniform.

Any Marx Soldiers of Fortune boxed sets with popgun or cannon.
